About Roots and Wings

Roots and Wings Kingston is a working group under OPIRG Kingston. It serves youth of colour between the ages of 8 and 14 in Kingston, ON, with specific programming targeted towards girls, trans, Two-Spirit, and gender non-conforming adolescents. Through Roots and Wings, youth engage in structured and enjoyable activities centered around heritage building, community engagement, identity exploration, skill development, and social justice.

Roots and Wings started in 2017 as a group for racialized girls, trans and gender nonconforming youth and their families to come together and build community through values of care and anti-oppression and through collaborative feminist praxes. We create programming that encourages youth to explore their identities, engage in local and global social justice issues, be empowered to teach and share their skills and talents, and build community and connect with local activists.

We are a small volunteer run and led organization that prioritizes building connections with families, community members, and local organizations. Roots & Wings is powered by family engagement and regular troupe participation. The Summer Program Coordinator will help to promote Roots & Wings throughout the community, engaging with local organizations and groups that interact with racialized families in Kingston. This is a flexible role. The incumbent may work remotely for much of the contract. **The Summer Program Coordinator must attend some events and outreach opportunities in person in Kingston, ON.** The incumbent will report to a member of the core R&W team and will work collaboratively with other members of the Roots and Wings Collective.

Role and Responsibilities

The Summer Program Coordinator will work closely with the R&W collective to increase youth and family engagement with Roots & Wings through strategic workshop planning, by coordinating community outreach opportunities, and by engaging Roots and Wings volunteers to help facilitate workshops and other programming.

Workshop Planning

- Draft and create a workshop calendar for fall and winter 2024-25 programming cycle in collaboration with the R&W collective
- Liaise with community organizations and potential workshop leads to coordinate workshop planning
- Brainstorm workshop activities based on relevant and child-appropriate social and environmental justice themes and with consideration of interests of R&W youth
- Track and report all necessary documents and information regarding workshop planning including, but not limited to, expenses, communications, and supplies needed and/or purchased
- Create and distribute promotional material for workshop registration

Community Outreach

- Communicate and collaborate with relevant community groups to promote R&W to families in the Kingston-region
- Facilitate and attend community events
- Communicate with current and potential Roots & Wings families by organizing a summer outreach event in collaboration with the R&W collective
- Record the success of various outreach opportunities for future reference
- Create and update a list of current R&W families and community contacts
- Brainstorm and implement new outreach opportunities

Volunteer Coordination

- Create and update list of current R&W volunteers
- Organize volunteer social opportunities
- Communicate with volunteers for workshop planning and facilitation
- Brainstorm ongoing outreach opportunities to engage potential R&W volunteers
- Manage volunteer communication
