OPIRG (Ontario Public Interest Research Group) Kingston is a local, student-directed, and community-minded group focused on social and environmental justice. We strive to create meaningful transformative change to benefit our local Queen's University and Kingston communities by facilitating education, research, and action for pertinent issues.

Canada Summer Jobs Youth Participant Eligibility

This position is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs program. This program has certain eligibility criteria for youth participants. Eligible youth must:

- 1. be between 15 and 30 years of age at the beginning of the employment period*;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment**; and,
- 3. have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

*The youth must be 15 years of age at the beginning of the employment period. The youth may be more than 30 years of age at the end of the employment period as long as the youth was 30 at the beginning of the employment period.

**Unfortunately, international students are not eligible participants. International students include anyone who is temporarily in Canada for studies and who is not a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada. Youth awaiting a refugee status ruling, as well as those who hold a temporary visitor visa, youth visa or work visa are ineligible.

Job description and application details

The Gardens Coordinator will plant, harvest and care for small-scale plots in and around Kingston, ON and Wolfe Island, ON. They will coordinate volunteer work days, Really Really Free Markets, and spearhead other initiatives as required.

Tasks and responsibilities include:

- \rightarrow Planting, harvesting, weeding, watering, and other gardening tasks as required
- \rightarrow Setting up Really Really Free Markets for food distribution
- \rightarrow Regularly updating volunteers about how the gardens are doing, work that needs to be done, etc.
- $\rightarrow\,$ Volunteer coordination for workdays
- \rightarrow Collaborating with diverse community volunteers
- → Implementing organic farming strategies
- \rightarrow Logistics and planning of food distribution
- \rightarrow Other duties as required.

The ideal candidate is someone with:

- → Physical strength and endurance to effectively complete manual labour tasks
- \rightarrow The ability to work outdoors in many different weather conditions
- $\rightarrow~$ Experience in agriculture or in a related field an asset
- → Access to own transportation an asset a car is ideal, though longer bike rides may be possible
- → Strong organizational and time-management skills
- → The ability to take initiative and work independently with minimal supervision, asking for clarification when necessary
- → Flexibility to work weekends as required

This position is **30 hours/week** at **\$16.55/hour** from **June 24** to **August 26, 2024** (9 weeks). **In-person work is required** in various locations around Kingston, ON and Wolfe Island, ON.

OPIRG Kingston welcomes the contributions that individuals from marginalized communities bring to our organization, and invites Indigenous people, Black people, people of colour, poor and working-class people and those on social assistance, women, members of 2SLGBTQIA+ communities, single parents, immigrants, and people with disabilities to apply.
